8. **Discuss/consider & act on appointing an ad hoc committee to provide citizen input in the preparation of the Park Master Plan**

City Administrator Juan Estrada informed Council that this item was part of the park master plan. He stated that it would be ideal to have a little league representative, school coach, public works personnel. He suggested he be given a directive to follow the Texas Parks & Wildlife guidelines to create a committee. Council Member Place 5 Joe Garcia stated that he agreed with the suggestion, he didn't have an objection. Council Member Place 2 Joanne Rodriguez stated she would like to be a part of the committee and if she wasn't available to have an alternate member of the council attend.

Motion made by Council Member Place 1 Alexandria Inocencio to give Mr. Estrada the directive to appoint an ad hoc committee to provide citizen input in the preparation of the Park Master Plan to include Council Member Place 2 Joanne Rodriguez as part of the committee

9. DISCUSS/CONSIDER & ON DEBRIS REMOVAL AT 337 E COLUNGO, REQUEST BY DANNY CANO
- Mr. Danny Cano came before the council to request debris removal from his rental property at 337 E Colungo. He informed council that the debris had been there approximately six years. He stated that they had permission from previous administrator to tear down and old house that was there. He stated that he wanted to demolish it because drug addicts were breaking in and staying in the old home. He stated that the previous administrator agreed to have the debris removed if they would take it down. He stated that he wanted to know what he needed to do because it had been approved by the previous city to remove the debris, he left and still here he was with the same issue. Council Member Place 5 Joe Garcia questioned how many times this item had been brought up to council. Council Member Place 3 Alicia Machado questioned what previous council had decided on the issue. Mr. Cano stated that several times city workers had attempted to pick up the debris but that they had been told to stop and not pick up anymore. Council Member Place 2 Joanne Rodriguez questioned the reason for them to stop. Mr. Cano replied that they would have to ask the Mayor. Mayor Obregon stated that she did not recall giving an order to maintenance to stop. She stated that she could remember 2017 when he had come before the council which was about the debris and including the fence. She stated that both things were discussed. Mr. Cano questioned why action was only taken on the fence and not the debris. Mayor Obregon replied that the item on the agenda was the fence and that is what he was requesting at the time. Mayor Obregon stated that she recalled that Mr. Cano was suppose to pay the container with the money reimbursed for the fence. Mr. Cano replied that why would he want to get reimbursed for the fence and use the money out of pocket to pay for a container. Mayor Obregon acknowledged that they had put a stop to previous administrator action to clean up properties without the approval from council. "He opened up a can of works" Mr. Cano replied why not finish what he started. I was given permission by Mr. Perez to tear down the house, that is why I did. Mayor Obregon stated that the letter Mr. Perez provided, was provided when he wasn't even in office. Mr. Cano questioned the letter Mr. Perez sent to previous administrator Rudy Alvarez. Council Member Place 2 Joanne Rodriguez stated that there were two different issues the fencing had nothing to do with the container. Mayor Obregon questioned why Mr. Cano had waited so long to come forward. He replied that he had gotten Mr. Perez's word so that he held that word to higher

standards because of the position Mr. Perez was in. He expected that if he was told it would get taken care of, it would. Mayor Pro-tem Castillo questioned City Secretary Juanita Fonseca if she recalled if a motion was made by previous council on the debris. She replied that the only item that went to the agenda was the fence. She further stated that the debris was not part of the agenda so no action could be taken on the debris. She further stated that the debris was never an agenda item, other items have made the agenda as far as cleaning up of lots but no action had been taken. Council Member Place 2 Joanne Rodriguez questioned if it was something Mr. Perez took upon himself. She questioned how the letter Mr. Perez sent to Mr. Alvarez came about. Council Member Place 5 Joe Garcia stated that the letter Mr. Perez addressed to Mr. Alvarez was to inform him of his doing. Council Member Place 3 Alicia Machado added that she understood where Mr. Cano was coming from but they also needed to acknowledge how long it had taken to get the trailer cleaned up across from Mr. Cano. Mrs. Esmeralda Cano requested to address the council. She informed council that during the time Danny approached Mr. Perez to get their project done there was a total of 7 projects in line, by the time it was their turn 4 projects had already been done. There were 2 others scheduled. It was her understanding that they had paid \$200 to get the service done. When it was their turn to pay the \$200 Mr. Perez told them there was a problem because it brought to his attention by a board member that he was opening a can of worms. She remembers approaching legal counsel, Pearsall attorney which stated that because the city had already showed precedence, the city should finish the seven scheduled and then council could decide what they would like to do. Mrs. Cano also stated that previous legal counsel had suggested the same for the city to do. Mrs. Cano added that as residents of Dilley we have to trust that the actions of the City Administrator or the council will be ad hereto. She further added that she recalls council attempted to create a schedule to remove nuisance but it was one of those things that fell through the crack and got tabled. She stated that it was a recommendation of the council at the time that the seven that Mr. Perez had scheduled should have been completed. If Mr. Perez was out of his duties to have allowed this, then council should have reprimanded the Administrator for his decision, and nothing like that ever transpired. Council Member Place 2 Joanne Rodriguez questioned Mr. Cano if the agreement was made with him or Mr. Lopez. Mrs. Cano replied that Danny is the owner and Mr. Lopez was the purchaser and Mr. Lopez worked for the city. Council Member Place 2 Joanne Rodriguez questioned what the pile consisted of, Mrs. Cano replied cement and center blocks and a couple of pieces of poles for the electricity. To their knowledge there isn't anything of any kind. Mrs. Cano stated that another property was allowed to throw debris and she sent those pictures to the previous Public Works Director, she stated that the collection site was shut down because of this. Council Member Place 1 Alexandria Inocencio questioned if Mrs. Cantu's property was the one approved to receive a free container. Mr. Estrada informed council that the situations were different. He further added that he had wanted to put the Cano's debris in that can but that it was already full enough and the weight would be too much to haul off. Mayor Obregon stated that the Cantu's debris was going to be removed by the family. Mayor Obregon asked for Mrs. Molly to explain what the city's responsibility would be. Council Member Place 2 Joanne Rodriguez added that she wasn't familiar with the situation but to her it seemed that it was making the city look bad because Mr. Perez gave his word and six years later we are with the same issue, they needed to get done with it already. She asked Mrs. Molly what her recommendation would be. Mrs. Molly informed the council that she had questioned City

Admin & City Secretary to look into the city to see if there was an agreement for the tearing down of the home and the city agreeing to remove the debris, there is nothing to bind the city, a letter after someone resigns does not bind the city to do the removal. Based on what is provided as evidence the city is not obligated to remove the debris. Council Member Place 1 Alexandria Inocencio questioned the cost to remove the debris. Mr. Estrada stated that it would be an average of \$1000 for container. Mayor Pro-tem Castillo added that the contract had just started in April so that they had another four containers available so they should provide him the containers to clean it up. Mayor Pro-tem Castillo questioned Mr. Cano if the city donated the containers if he could come up with the machinery to do the cleaning. Mr. Cano stated that he could look around to see what he could do and then get back to Mr. Estrada. Council member Place 5 Joe Garcia stated that if he got his own machinery he would have to pay out of pocket. Mayor Pro-tem Castillo stated that with code enforcement they couldn't have them getting a fine every month for having the debris there. He further stated that it was an eye sore. Mr. Estrada added that the containers were for citizens in distress and he could check with Blake to see if this qualified. Mayor Pro-tem Castillo wanted to call Mr. Blake to ask the question. Council Member Place 5 Joe Garcia stated that they needed to finish this item. Council Member Place 3 Alicia Machado suggested to table the item and then come back after speaking to Blake. Council Member Place 2 Joanne Rodriguez added that the item needed to be resolved today. Council Member Place 5 Joe Garcia stated that in this opinion they were going to resolve this in good faith. In honoring Mr. Cano here for the city to pick up the debris and from the information that has been provide to us the testimony from Mrs. Cano & Mr. Cano, I say we go ahead and take action on it and regardless on what republic states on the dumpsters or canisters I go ahead an make a motion.

Motion made by Council Member Place 5 Joe Garcia for the city to provide a container for the debris on 337 E Colungo as requested by Mr. Cano to be placed
City Secretary questioned Mr. Garcia if that was one or two containers Mr. Garcia amended his motion to state two (2) Containers.

11. DISCUSS/CONSIDER & ACT ON CITY OF DILLEY, TEXAS EIGHTH AMENDMENT OF DECLARATION OF LOCAL STATE OF DISASTER DUE TO PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY
Mayor & council alternated reading the updated material on the declaration.
Mrs. Molly gave a summary of the changes. Main changes were the specific guidelines for bars and restaurants and the change in occupancy from 50% to 75% taking effect on June 12. Mrs. Molly further stated that she had sent the guidelines to Mr. Estrada to distribute. Council Member Place 3 Alicia Machado questioned the curfew and Mrs. Molly stated that the curfew had been lifted. Only thing in place was the gatherings. She also stated that the city facilities were now open. Mr. Estrada added that if council decided to open the city offices he would recommend it was contingent to receiving all the supplies to sanitize and

the face shields for the library. Library will remain closed due to not having the face shields yet.

She further informed them that the plan and procedures were put together based on the guidelines recommended by the CDC.

Mr. Estrada informed council that we had some issues with customers ordering containers to remove debris from other garbage customers and in order to enforce a penalty if they didn't remove the containers this ordinance would need to be adopted to be able to enforce the current contract. He stated that Blake with Republic was available via zoom for any questions. Council Member Place 3 Alicia Machado questioned the ordinance. Mrs. Molly informed council that this ordinance would allow the city to enforce the contract and penalize anyone in violation of the ordinance.

Mr. Estrada informed council that the county was requesting to use the municipal court building and that they submitted the guidelines that they would be enforcing during the elections. The guidelines submitted were what the CDC recommended. Mrs. Molly's concern was that the building is city owned and who would be cleaning the building.
Motion made by Council Member Place 5 Joe Garcia to authorize Frio County permission to use the Municipal Court Building for early voting the dates of July 6, 2020 - July10, 2020 & Election Day July 15, 2020 contingent to COVID-19 re-opening guidelines

Mr. Estrada informed council that this was an amendment to the hot tax agreement. The amendment was to extend one more year to wrap up the audit. Council Member Place 5 Joe Garcia questioned the fee for the audit. City Secretary informed Mr. Garcia the fee was \$1800 for six hotels.

17. **DISCUSS/CONSIDER & ACT ON AMENDMENT TO ATTACHMENT B (FEE SCHEDULE) OF THE MASTER PROFESSIONAL SERVICE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF DILLEY AND BUREAU VERITAS NORTH AMERICA, INC.**
Mr. Estrada informed council that the residential fees needed to be updated as per the residential code that was adopted by council in April of 2019. Mr. Estrada summarized the fee schedule provided to council for review. Council Member Place 5 Joe Garcia questioned Mr. Estrada who had come up with the dollars signs. City Secretary asked to address the council to add that the fees were submitted by Bureau Veritas as per legislation approval. She further added that legislation did not have a cap as to what the city could charge for administrative fees. Admin was recommending a 10% fee for administrative fees. Council Member Place 3 Alicia Machado questioned where the fee schedule came from, City Secretary replied that it came from the residential code. Mrs. Machado further questioned how many people had we collected this amount of money from since April of 2019, City Secretary replied that we had not had anyone apply for a residential permit. Mrs. Machado told city Secretary that we have had ad ons, City Secretary replied that from April 2019 when the city passed the residential codes, because the city did not used to have the residential code adopted, no one had applied for a residential permit with the exception of one they had received earlier during the week. Mrs. Machado questioned that everyone that had applied didn't have additions. City Secretary replied that we had had plenty of permits but were like carports, fences, slabs and all those categories fell under miscellaneous. The only

permit that falls under residential are permits like for example those that are going to tear down a wall to expand the home to include electrical and plumbing. Mrs. Machado questioned if your not going to have electrical and plumbing. City Secretary replied if your knocking down a wall that's and addition and requires plans to be submitted. Council Member Place 3 Alicia Machado stated well what if your not knocking down a wall. City Secretary replied, we as the city don't know the type of construction until the customer tells us, If the customer tells me they are knocking down a wall then yes the permit falls under a residential permit and those plans are submitted to bureau Veritas. Council Member Place 3 Alicia Machado questioned the permit fees. City Secretary informed council that the fees include the plan review and inspection. The fees are based per trade. She gave an example based on the permit application that indirectly was in question. She explained that if that customer would have paid the fees that should have been paid that the amount for the building inspection would've been \$100 that included plan review and inspection. Council Member place 3 Alicia Machado stated that she understood and believes the problem was miss communication. City administrator Juan Estrada asked city attorney if she had anything to add, she stated that she would have to do research based on the fees and the size of Dilley all she reviewed were the rates submitted. City Secretary stated that she had spoke to Susan Vinson who is the one in charge of the residential permits and she informed that the city can charge whatever rates they would like there isn't a cap. Mayor called for a motion City Secretary asked to add that if item is tabled and there is a permit application, the city would not be able to charge the correct rates because the table presented corresponding to the residential rates was not adopted and she just wanted everyone to be aware that the incorrect rates weren't be charged its just that the city can't charge if the rates aren't adopted. Council Member Place 5 Joe Garcia questioned that they couldn't charge those rates. City Secretary replied that we could not charge those rates because they were not part of the citys adopted rate schedule that's what it was on agenda for, and she wanted to make everyone aware she was just doing the right thing, that it wasn't miscommunication or misinformation, She gives everyone the correct information, when she gets asked she provides the correct information, if the customer doesn't agree with it, then that is a different story, but she does provide the correct information and if the item gets table the city will not be able to charge those rates. Council Member Place 5 Joe Garcia stated so your saying the city will still get charge those rates, city secretary replied yes because Bureau Veritas is doing the work per the ordinance the city adopted in 2019. Council Place 5 Joe Garcia stated, well we adopted the ordinance.

Council Member Place 5 Joe Garcia stated that the youngsters were anxious to go and play in the pool. He further stated that he thought as long as we followed the CDC guidelines and what governor recommended half the minimum. Council Member Place 3 Alicia Machado stated well he opened it. Council Member Place 1 Alexandria Inocencio questioned if the city was ready to operate the pool. Did the city have certified lifeguards. City Secretary stated

that we had about 7 that might be able to work. She further stated that Red Cross would not be coming down to the facility to certify due to COVID-19. City Administrator added that Public Works would need an additional week/week and a half to get the pool up to par. Motion made by Council Member Place 2 Joanne Rodriguez to open up the pool as soon as the city can have it ready and available.

City Administrator informed council that because of the Coronavirus pandemic the city had incurred additional expenses for example overtime and legal expenses. He stated that the government had these relief funds to assist entities for 100% reimbursement of expenses. Mr. Estrada stated that the relief funds were in the amount of \$250,000. He also stated that for the size of our city and county the CRF is what would be available due to the pandemic. Council Member Place 5 Joe Garcia questioned City Admin on the items introduced to receive these relief funds. Mr. Estrada replied that allowed cost would be like legal, supplies bought for sanitation and different incurred cost like the shields for all the departments, he also stated like Chris Eguia the computer tech that has to assist with the video to comply with Governor request. Basically, anything that is COVID related. Council Member Place 3 Alicia Machado stated that she thought it was like a monies to pay employees.


