Rules of Conduct Policy

It is the policy of the City Administrator and City Council that patrons of The Dilley Public Library have the right to use library materials and services without being unduly disturbed or impeded by other library users, and the patrons and staff have the right to a secure congenial environment.

Rules

- 1. Any behavior that disrupts or hinders public use of the library is prohibited on library property. This includes, but is not limited to, loud or boisterous behavior, verbal or physical harassment, drunkenness, running, and fighting.
- 2. Seating at library tables, computer carrels and chairs is limited to number of persons for whom the furniture was designed.
- 3. Smoking or chewing tobacco is not permitted in the library. Public eating is not permitted in the library, only when specifically approved as part of a program.
- 4. Strollers may not be left obstructing the entry or exit. Strollers are not permitted in the library; they are to be left at the front desk or stationed where the patrons is seated.
- 5. Taking surveys, distributing leaflets, and other similar activities is not permitted.
- 6. Animals accept those to aid persons with disabilities in the library, except as part of a library sponsored program; animals may not be left unattended on library property.
- 7. Parents or other legal guardians are responsible for the behavior of their minor children in the library. All children under 12 yr.'s of age must be accompanied by an adult. The library is not responsible for accidents for unsupervised children.
- 8. The violation of federal or state laws or local ordinances will not be permitted on library property. Theft, vandalism, and mutilation of library property are criminal offences and may be prosecuted. The library reserves the right to inspect all bags, briefcases, backpacks, and other such items when the staff has

- a reason to believe. There is due cause violation. The library is not responsible for personal belongings left unattended.
- 9. Consumption of alcoholic beverages is not permitted on library property.
- 10. Failure to comply with these Rules of Conduct may result in the loss of library use privileges.
